Presentations

Seacoast Mental Health Center:

Executive Director of Seacoast Mental Health Center Jay Couture and Roland Lamy gave an update of COVID-19 impacts on the Mental Health profession including lost revenue, costs for PPE, telemedicine startup costs and the inability to see patients in an emotional state.

Granite State Independent Living

Deborah Ritcey, President and CEO of Granite State Independent Living, spoke about the effects COVID-19 was having on her agency including: difficulty to secure PPE; phone calls to clients instead of providing in-home visits; concerns about the toll the pandemic is having on the mental health and wellbeing of clients.

Home Care, Hospice & Pallative Care Alliance of New Hampshire

President and CEO Gina Balkus stated her organization is seeing a decline in referrals from hospitals and physicians and clients declining care due to the COVID-19 virus. Staffing shortages are increasing; social workers are doing telehealth in place of in person visits; and they are seeing an increased case load in Hospice.

Harbor House - NH Homeless Veterans

Henry Och, Chief of Operations, The Partnership for Successful Living, gave an overview of the services his organization provides for veterans including but not limited to housing and veteran's support and employment services. Availability of PPEs is still an issue. They have gotten some funding from CARES Act which has helped them to find emergency housing for homeless veterans.

Federal Guidance Discussion

GOFERR General Counsel Nancy Smith reviewed the 3 pages of guidance the U.S. Treasury put out relative to the CARES ACT. The U.S. Treasure is using a "reasonable person" standard to determine allow ability of costs. The single audit provision will apply to any entity who gets a total of \$750,000 or greater in total of all Federal funds. CARES Act money cannot be used to "match" and other federal monies such as FEMA. The funds cannot be used to replace lost revenue of municipalities and counties but if they took out a loan to cover the loss, CARES could pay the interest.
