The recipient must use the Individual/Family Crisis Counseling Services Encounter Log, Group Encounter Log, Weekly Tally Sheet, Adult and Child/Youth Assessment and Referral Tools, and Service Provider and Participant Feedback Surveys.
- B. The recipient must identify an individual to serve as the lead contact for management of all data collection activities. All staff involved in outreach and service delivery must be specifically trained in the data collection requirements using the FEMA CCP data toolkit and data must be entered via the mobile application and/or the CCP Online Data Collection and Evaluation System http://www.ccpdata.org.
