Pursuant to my authority under RSA 21-P:43; RSA 4:45; RSA 4:47; and Executive Order 2020-04, as extended by Executive Orders 2020-05, 2020-08, 2020-09, 2020-10, and 2020-14 I have approved your written request, in attachment, to take the following actions related to the CARES Act Coronavirus Relief Funds:

- 1. Transfer \$30,000,000 in Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security (CARES) Act Funding to the New Hampshire Department of Employment Security (NHES) in support of the COVID-19 Long Term Care Stabilization Program created by Emergency Order #31, as modified and expanded by Emergency Order #45 and #55. Budgeted consistent with the information in the request in attachment, effective through December 30, 2020. (100% Federal Funds)
- 2. Authorize NHES to accept and expend \$30,000,000 from the GOFERR in support of the COVID-19 Long Term Care Stabilization Program established by Emergency Order #31, as modified and extended by Emergency Order #45 and #55, to cover the extended period of eligibility of stipend payments outlined in the COVID-19 Long Term Care Stabilization Program. Budgeted consistent with the information in the request in attachment, effective through December 30, 2020. (100% Other Funds)

Effective upon your approval through December 31, 2020. 100% Federal Funds.

EXPLANATION

In response to the COVID-19 Public Health Emergency, on April 16th, Governor Sununu issued Emergency Order #31 which established the COVID-19 Long Term Care Stabilization Program. The COVID-19 Long Term Care Stabilization Program will help stabilize the front line work not able to be conducted remotely by certain qualifying Medicaid providers. The program was modified by Emergency Order #45 on May 18, 2020, and extended by Emergency Order #55 on June 25, 2020.

The program includes providers that support aging seniors and people with developmental disabilities, as well as individuals with mental health and substance abuse disorders, youth residential treatment providers, and developmental disability service providers who provide residential or community/home-based care. The program provides temporary stabilization funding to incentivize front line, direct care workers to remain or rejoin this critical workforce during the COVID-19 Emergency. The program helps ensure that these critical providers who support some of New Hampshire's most vulnerable persons are able to provide continued services throughout the COVID-19 Emergency. Under the program, qualifying full-time front line employees will receive \$300 per week and qualifying part-time front line employees will receive \$300 per week and qualifying part-time front line employees will receive \$300 per week and qualifying part-time front line employees will receive \$150 per week.

This is a short-term program intended to provide financial support as quickly as possible while the State seeks any necessary amendments to the Medicaid State Plan and/or Appendix K approval through the 1915 (c) waivers from the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS) in order to operationalize additional Medicaid assistance. The overall program will end on July 31, 2020. The first 10 weeks of the program was funded by an initial \$45 Million transfer to NHES from the GOFERR. This transfer will fund the remainder of the program.
