The Governor's Office for Emergency Relief and Recovery (GOFERR) requests to amend the authority to sweep the remaining \$255,103 from the New Hampshire Judicial Council (NHJC) from their Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security (CARES) Act Funding awarded. Effective upon your approval through December 30, 2020. 100% Federal Funds.

EXPLANATION

On July 17, 2020 the Governor authorized the allocation and expenditure of \$1,426,960 to the New Hampshire Judicial Council; \$900,000 for CASA, \$326,960 for technology upgrades, and \$200,000 for private guardian ad litem costs. NHJC disbursed the entire \$900,000 to CASA, \$271,857 of \$326,960 available for technology upgrades to the New Hampshire Public Defender, and spent none of the \$200,000 on private guardian ad litem costs at this point.

The entire \$200,000 intended for this purpose can lapse. This request seeks approval to lapse the remaining \$255,103 of the \$1,426,960 provided to NHJC.

Effective upon your approval, the GOFERR will work with Department of Administrative Services to return these funds. Returning these unused or excess appropriations to the GOFERR will give the Governor the ability to reallocate these funds to new or existing programs to ensure they are expended before December 30, 2020.
