1. Authority for the Department of Health and Human Services (DHHS), Division of Public Health Services to accept and expend funds from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), entitled Epidemiology and Laboratory Capacity (ELC) under the Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security (CARES) Act in the amount of \$40,953,829 effective retroactively to April 8, 2021. Budgeted consistent with the information in the request in attachment, effective through July 31, 2022. (100% Federal Funds).

EXPLANATION

This request is being made to accept the additional grant funds available for SFY 2021 to administer the Epidemiology and Laboratory Capacity for Prevention and Control of Emerging Infectious Diseases (ELC) under the American Rescue Plan Act of 2021(ARP), Public Law 117-2. This request is RETROACTIVE because time was needed to review the grant guidelines and work with stakeholders on a plan for the use of these funds. These special ELC Project E funds are to be used to prevent, prepare for, and respond to the coronavirus pandemic (COVID-19). This ELC funding is to be used in support of K-12 schools and overnight summer camp testing.

This will include contracting to provide specimen collection and testing, testing coordination, technical assistance, contract management and support to schools and camps. Monitoring the indicators associated with these activities are intended to assist the State of New Hampshire in making data-driven policy decisions regarding testing, mitigation and prevention efforts. The notice of additional funds awarded was received April 8, 2021.

The funds are to be budgeted as follows:

Class 041 The funds will be used to pay for audit fund set aside.

Class 102 The funds will be used to pay for contracts.

In response to the anticipated two-part question, "Can these funds be used to offset General Funds?" and "What is the compelling reason for not offsetting General Funds?" the Division offers the following information: These funds may not be used to offset General Funds as they are specifically granted to the State for the purpose of providing the services described above.

These funds will not change the program eligibility levels. No new program will be established with the acceptance of these funds.

Area served: Statewide

Source of Funds: 100% Federal Funds from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC). The notice of supplemental funds awarded was received April, 8, 2021. They were not added to the operating budget because these are new funds recently granted to the State to assist in the public health Coronavirus response and were not anticipated at the time the budget was developed.

If Federal Funds become no longer available, General Funds will not be requested to support the program expenditures.
