### **EXPLANATION**

DHHS is exploring opportunities to expand the provision of mental health services in New Hampshire, of which there is a critical need that was exacerbated by the COVID-19 pandemic. Interim final rule Section 35.6 (b) (1) (xviii) from the US Treasury on the allowed uses for COVID public health recovery under ARPA SLFRF recognizes providing mental health treatment and other behavioral health services as an allowed use for the recovery from the public health emergency. Before the state can determine the feasibility of possible investments for mental health treatment, preliminary work requiring the assistance of the specialized legal services at Pierce Atwood, LLP to facilitate these efforts is required that will be funded by this request to use remaining CRF funds. DOJ will enter into a retainer agreement to obtain these outside legal services to assist in this evaluation to obtain additional mental health treatment capacity that has been exacerbated by COVID-19.
